**Yearly Vital Statistics Report**  
**2018-2019**

The Clinical Rehabilitation and Clinical Mental Health Counseling program at East Central University is fully accredited by the Council on Rehabilitation Education (CORE) through October 31, 2023 [www.core-rehab.org](http://www.core-rehab.org) and through Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP) through October 31, 2023 [www.cacrep.org](http://www.cacrep.org). The CRCMHC Program is required annually to report program outcomes for students and prospective students.

In 2018-2019, there were 67 CRCMHC students enrolled in the Fall 2018 and 55 in the Spring of 2019. Twenty-two students graduated from the Clinical Rehabilitation and Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program in 2018-2019. Of the students who graduated from the CRCMHC Program, 100% were employed. Graduates are employed in outpatient counseling agencies, inpatient counseling programs, state and private rehabilitation settings.

Completion rates for CRCMHC Program students is 75%. Students in the program complete their Master's degree within 3 years if enrolled full time or within 6 years if enrolled part time.

In 2018-2019, Students took both the National Counselor Exam (NCE) and the Certified Rehabilitation Counselors Exam. The pass rate for program students taking the NCE was 83%. This was comparable to the national pass rate for this exam. Students who took the CRC had a pass rate of 70%. The national pass rate for the CRC; however, is only 50%. This is an increase of 20% over the previous year's results in which the ECU pass rate was only 50%.

The CRCMHC Program student body is 26% male, and 74% female. Seventeen percent of CRCMHC students are Native American, 8% of program students are African American and 50% of students are Caucasian. Two percent of program students are international students.

This year students attended the Oklahoma Counselor Association Midwinter conference, the Oklahoma Rehabilitation Association conference, and the National Council on Rehabilitation Education Conference.
