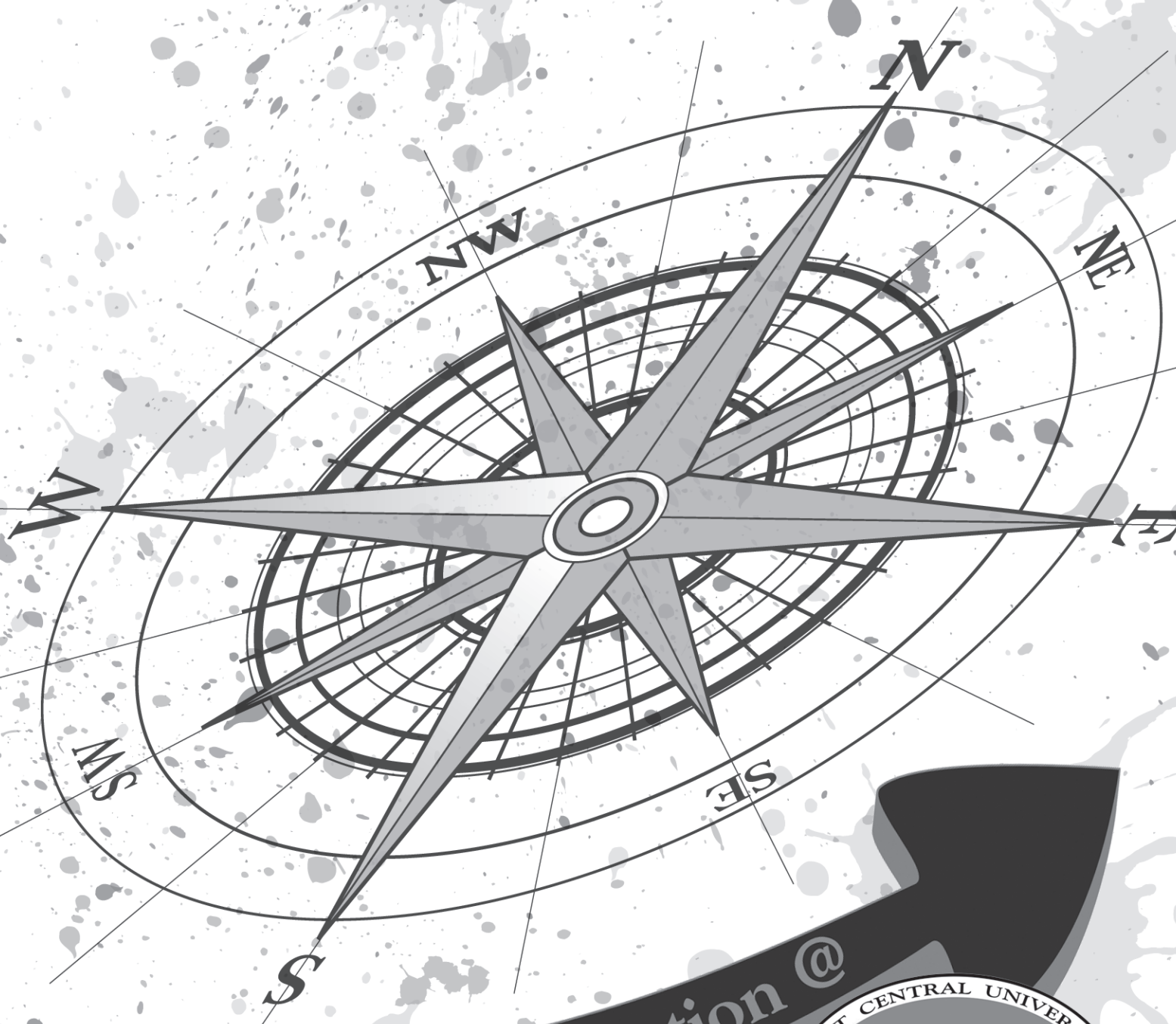
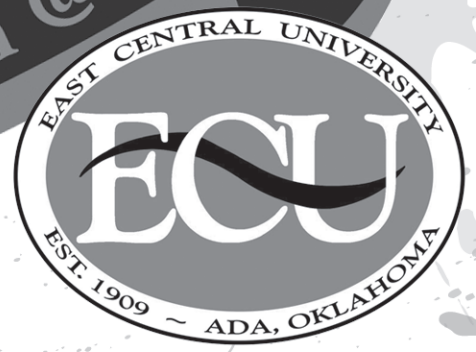

Policies & Procedures for ALL Semesters

General Information

New Students - Students MUST be admitted to ECU before participating in academic advisement and enrollment. Beginning Freshmen must have an admission application, official high school transcripts, ACT test reports and immunization records sent to the ECU Office of Admissions and Records prior to enrollment date. All beginning freshmen must make an appointment to attend advisement and enrollment. College Transfer Students should file an admission application, previous official college and high school records and immunization records in the ECU Office of Admissions and Records, preferably at least two weeks prior to enrollment. Former East Central University Students, who have attended another university since attending ECU or who have not attended in the previous two years, should report to the Office of Admissions and Records to be readmitted. These returning students who have attended another college since ECU should have official transcripts sent to the Office of Admissions and Records before the enrollment date.

Graduate Standing—Applicants to the Master of Accounting, Master of Education, the Master of Science in Psychological Services, or the Master of Science in Human Resources degree programs should contact the School of Graduate Studies (Room 102, Fentem Hall) for admission information.

Graduate students who have been admitted to a degree program and have conferred with an advisor, or graduate students not working toward a degree, may sign their own enrollment cards at registration. Graduate students signing their own enrollment cards are responsible for adhering to all published School of Graduate Studies rules and regulations.

Individual Studies—A superior student may pursue special academic interest in consultation with an instructor. The Advisor, Faculty, Department Chair, and School Dean must approve the course. A section number must be obtained from the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs (Suite 208, Danley Hall) before enrollment.

Private Instruction (TBA's)—A student may earn credit for private instruction taken in selected fields from a faculty member with the approval of the appropriate Department Chair and Dean of the College/School offering the course. A section number must be obtained from the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs (Suite 208, Danley Hall) before enrollment.

WITHDRAWING FROM THE UNIVERSITY

(All Classes)

Refund Policy—Changes in schedules and complete withdrawals from the institution **during the first ten days of classes in a regular semester or during the first five days of a summer term** will result in full credit for courses dropped. No refunds will be made after the first ten days of classes in a regular semester or after the first five days of a summer term.

Note—Students must withdraw from all classes through the Office of Admissions and Records. Withdrawal requests must be submitted in writing. Students may either fax the request to (580) 559-5432, e-mail the request to parmstro@ecok.edu or process the request in person in room 111, Administration Building. No requests will be accepted via the phone.

Withdrawal - Return of Title IV Funds

Federal regulations require that a student must attend classes until at least 60% of the semester has passed to earn their Title IV funds. Withdrawing prior to the 60% point will result in the calculation of earned and unearned Title IV funds. The unearned funds must be returned to the Title IV programs by the school and by the student. The University will bill the student for the amount of the funds returned to the Title IV programs by the University. The student **will be responsible** for the amount of the refund by the University **and** any student repayment to Title IV funds.

Financial aid recipients who withdraw may be expected to repay a certain portion of their awards that were disbursed to provide assistance with living expenses while attending school. Examples of refunds and repayments are available upon request at the Financial Aid Office, 100 Administration, or call (580) 559-5241.

Reminder—By enrolling in classes, the student creates a financial liability in the amount of the fees, tuition, and other charges pertinent to the enrollment process. This financial liability can be eliminated only by payment from the student or his/her agent or by formal cancellation of the enrollment by the student **BEFORE** the semester starts. **Failure to attend class(es) does NOT reduce the liability.** *Failure to receive Financial Aid does NOT reduce the liability.*

STUDENTS WILL NOT BE CANCELLED FOR NON-PAYMENT OF FEES. THEREFORE, AFTER HAVING ENROLLED, STUDENTS WHO FIND THEY WILL NOT BE ATTENDING CLASSES, SHOULD CANCEL THEIR ENROLLMENT IN WRITING IMMEDIATELY. A REQUEST FOR CANCELLATION SHOULD BE PROCESSED IN PERSON OR MAILED TO THE ECU OFFICE OF ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS. THE REQUEST MAY ALSO BE FAXED TO 580/559-5432 OR E-MAILED TO parmstro@ecok.edu. IF A STUDENT DOES NOT CANCEL HIS/HER ENROLLMENT PRIOR TO THE FIRST OFFICIAL DAY OF CLASSES, HE/SHE MAY BE LIABLE FOR ALL TUITION AND FEES.

2012 Commencement Ceremonies

Bachelor's and Master's Candidates

May 12 - Spring Commencement is scheduled at the end of the spring semester. Spring 2012 and Summer 2012 graduates will participate in this ceremony. **THERE WILL BE NO SUMMER COMMENCEMENT.** Spring graduates must apply for graduation by January 25, 2012 and Summer graduates must apply by April 13, 2012.

Cancellation of Courses and Staffing

East Central University reserves the right to cancel any course in which the enrollment is insufficient. Should this become necessary, students will be notified by mail and may adjust their schedules without penalty or receive a full refund of tuition and fees.

The University also reserves the right to change faculty assignments and, therefore, cannot guarantee students the faculty of their choice.

DROPPING AND ADDING INDIVIDUAL CLASSES

(While Remaining in Other Classes)

1. The dropping of single classes while remaining in others is permitted through the first ten days of classes in a regular semester or during the first five days of a summer regular and ten-week term with a full refund of fees. The adding of classes is permitted through the first *FIVE (5)* days of a regular semester and the summer regular and ten-week term.
2. The procedure for dropping and adding classes is as follows:
 - a. Obtain Drop/Add Card in Office of Admissions and Records.
 - b. The advisor signature is not required to change a schedule. Faculty signatures are not required unless the course is closed and permission is being granted to override the course limit. Students making changes without consulting an advisor assume responsibility for the changes.
 - c. Report to Office of Admissions and Records or any enrollment center with completed form to have Drop/Add Card processed.
 - d. Additional charges will be collected when enrollment fees are paid.
3. Students who pay their enrollment tuition and fees prior to drop/add transactions must pay all additional charges incurred by the tenth day of classes in a regular semester or by the fifth day of a summer term.
4. If drop/add transactions occur after the deadline listed above in #3, all enrollment charges must have been paid. **ALL ADDITIONAL CHARGES MUST BE PAID ON THE SAME DAY THE TRANSACTION OCCURS.**
5. No refunds are given for classes dropped after the tenth day of classes in a regular semester or after the fifth day of a summer term unless the class is a second half-semester course. Refunds are given on second-half semester courses through the first five days of the class.

THE FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 is a federal law which states (A) that a written institutional policy must be established and (B) that a statement of adopted procedures covering the privacy rights of students be made available. The law provides that the institution will maintain the confidentiality of student education records.

East Central University accords all the rights under the law to students who are declared independent. No one outside the institution shall have access to nor will the institution disclose any information about students' education records without the written consent of students except to personnel within the institution, to officials of other institutions in which students seek to enroll, to persons or organizations providing students financial aid, to accrediting agencies carrying out their accreditation function, to persons in compliance with a judicial order, and to persons in an emergency in order to protect the health or safety of students or other persons. All these exceptions are permitted under the act.

Within the East Central University community, only those members, individually or collectively, acting in the students' educational interest are allowed access to student education records. These members include (as defined by the institution) such officers as Registrar, Business Manager, Financial Aid, Admissions, Student Personnel, etc., and academic personnel within the limitations of their need to know.

At its discretion, the institution may provide directory information in accordance with the provisions of the act to include: student name, address, telephone number, campus e-mail address, date and place of birth, major field of study, enrollment status, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, the most recent previous institution attended by the student, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, and weight and height of members of athletic teams. Students may withhold directory information by notifying the university registrar in writing.

Request for non-disclosure will be honored by the institution for any one academic year; therefore, authorization to withhold directory information must be filed annually in the Office of the Registrar.

The law provides students with the right to inspect and review information contained in their education records, to challenge the contents of their education records, to have a hearing if the outcome of the challenge is unsatisfactory, and to submit explanatory statements for inclusion in their files if they feel the decisions of the hearing panels to be unacceptable. The Vice-President for Academic Affairs at East Central University has been designated by the institution to coordinate the inspection and review procedures for student education records, which include admissions, personal, academic, and financial files, and academic, cooperative education, and placement records. Students wishing to review their education records must make written requests to the Vice-President, listing the item or items of interest. Only records covered by the act will be made available within forty-five days of the request. Students may have copies made of their records with certain exceptions, (e.g., a copy of the academic record for which a financial "hold" exists, or a transcript of an original or source document which exists elsewhere). These copies would be made at the students' expense at prevailing rates which are listed in the current catalog.

Education records do not include records of instructional, administrative, and educational personnel which are the sole possession of the maker and are not accessible

or revealed to any individual except a temporary substitute, records of the law enforcement unit, student health records, employment records or alumni records. Health records, however, may be reviewed by physicians of the students' choosing.

Students may not inspect and review the following as outlined by the act: financial information submitted by their parents, confidential letters and recommendations associated with admissions, employment or job placement, or honors to which they have waived their rights of inspection and review, or education records containing information about more than one student, in which case the institution will permit access only to that part of the record which pertains to the inquiring student. The institution is not required to permit students to inspect and review confidential letters and recommendations placed in their files prior to January 1, 1975, provided those letters were collected under established policies of confidentiality and were used only for the purposes for which they were collected.

Students who believe that their education records contain information that is inaccurate or misleading, or is otherwise in violation of their privacy or other rights may discuss their problems informally with the Vice-President. If the decisions are in agreement with the students' requests, the appropriate records will be amended. If not, the students will be notified within a reasonable period of time that the records will not be amended; and they will be made aware of their right to a formal hearing. Student requests for a formal hearing must be made in writing to the Vice-President who, within a reasonable period of time after receiving such requests will inform students of the date, place, and the time of the hearing. Students may present evidence relevant to the issues raised and may be assisted or represented at the hearings by one or more persons of their choice, including attorneys, at the students' expense. The hearing panels which will adjudicate such challenges will be the Vice-President, the Graduate Dean, representatives of the Vice-President for Student Development, and the Academic Dean of the students' college.

Decisions of the hearing panels will be final, will be based solely on the evidence presented at the hearing, and will consist of written statements summarizing the evidence and stating the reasons for the decisions, and will be delivered to all parties concerned. The education records will be corrected or amended in accordance with the decisions of the hearing panels. If the decisions are in favor of the students. If the decisions are unsatisfactory to the students, the students may place the institution statements setting forth any reasons for disagreeing with the decision of the hearing panels. The statements will be placed in the education records, maintained as part of the students' records, and released whenever the records in question are disclosed.

Students who believe that the adjudications of their challenges were unfair, or not in keeping with the provisions of the act may request in writing, assistance from the president of the institution. Further, students who believe that their rights have been abridged, may file complaints with The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act Office (FERPA), Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Washington, D.C., 20201, concerning the alleged failures of East Central University to comply with the act.

Revisions and clarifications will be published as experience with the law and institution's policy warrants.

The ECU Writing Center is located on the first floor of *Faust Hall, Room 147*. Facilities include a **quiet area** where you can work alone or with a tutor, free from outside distractions. Open 9 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Friday. The Center offers assistance to anyone who wants help with composing a paper. Appointments are not necessary, and services are free. The Writing Center is staffed by student tutors who have been specially trained to help compose clearly and articulately. The tutor can help throughout the process of composing a paper:

Prewriting—If you've ever been stuck when trying to write a paper, you can understand how frustrating it is. The tutors can help you "solve" an assignment. They can help you plan your approach to the assignment, or they can help you explore ideas you might want to write about, ending the frustration.

Drafting—Sometimes libraries, dorms, and apartments offer many distractions to the struggling writer. The Writing Center's quiet area and computer facility offer the ideal location for you when you're drafting your paper.

Revising—Once you've completed drafting, the Writing Center tutors can help you decide if your paper is organized in the most logical, expedient way. The tutors can help you identify areas in your paper where additional details and examples might improve your point. They can also help identify areas where readers might be confused or misled.

Editing—Once you have your paper arranged and developed to your satisfaction, the tutors can help you proof read your paper for surface errors. While we do not offer a proof reading service, we can help you learn to identify your mistakes and to polish your own writing.

ECU ENTRY-LEVEL ASSESSMENT POLICY: All students who enroll at East Central University as first-time entering Freshmen and transfer students who enter the University with six or fewer semester credit hours attempted are required to participate in entry-level assessment. In addition to complying with published ECU admission standards, participation in entry-level assessment may include other activities such as taking placement tests, completing student surveys, and contributing to other entry-level assessment-related activities.

II. Non-Priority Enrollment for Walk-in Transfer, Former and Continuing Students - November 7 - January 9, 2012

1. Admission and Advising

Transfer and Former Students - The Office of Admissions and Records will admit transfer and former students during this period as they apply and are determined to be admissible. The Office of Admissions and Records will assign advisors according to Department Chair instructions. Students should be advised during faculty office hours OR by appointment OR in the appropriate dean's office if faculty advisors are not available.

NOTE - Current undergraduate students - If changing major, go to previously assigned advisor and pick up advisement folder and Transfer of Major and/or Advisor form. Report to department chair of new major for assignment of advisor and to deliver advisement folder.

2. Enrollment - November 1 - January 9, 2012

Enrollment Centers - The Enrollment Centers may enroll transfer students, continuing students, or former students between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Office of Admissions and Records or Academic Advising Center - The Office of Admissions and Records and the Academic Advising Center may enroll transfer students, continuing students, or former students between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on days when the Enrollment Centers are either closed or conducting other business.

III. Enrollment Day for Beginning Freshmen - January 10, 2012

Advisement and enrollment for beginning freshmen is at 8:30 a.m., January 10, 2012 in the Raymond Estep Multi-Media Center, University Center. An appointment for beginning freshmen enrollment must be made in the Academic Advising Center, Room 111 Danley Hall. Call (580) 559-5696 for an appointment.

NOTICE - Beginning Freshmen - ACT Test must be taken to validate admission of all beginning freshmen with less than 24 semester hours attempted. If test has not been taken, register immediately in the Center for Continuing Education and Community Services (Room 115, Fentem Hall) to take the test. Registration may be done by phone by calling (580) 559-5456 or online at www.ecok.edu/ce.

IV. Drop and Add Enrollment

Students may drop and add courses in any enrollment center or in the Office of Admissions and Records. Advisor signatures are not required to drop or add classes. Faculty signatures are required to override a closed class status. Students making changes without consulting an advisor assume responsibility for the changes.

V. Payment of Tuition and Fees

2. **Institutional Charges** - Institutional charges (i.e. tuition, fees, dorm and apartment rent, board, fines, etc.) are withheld from first available funds, including financial aid, student payroll, and scholarship checks.

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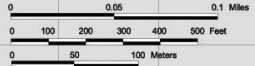
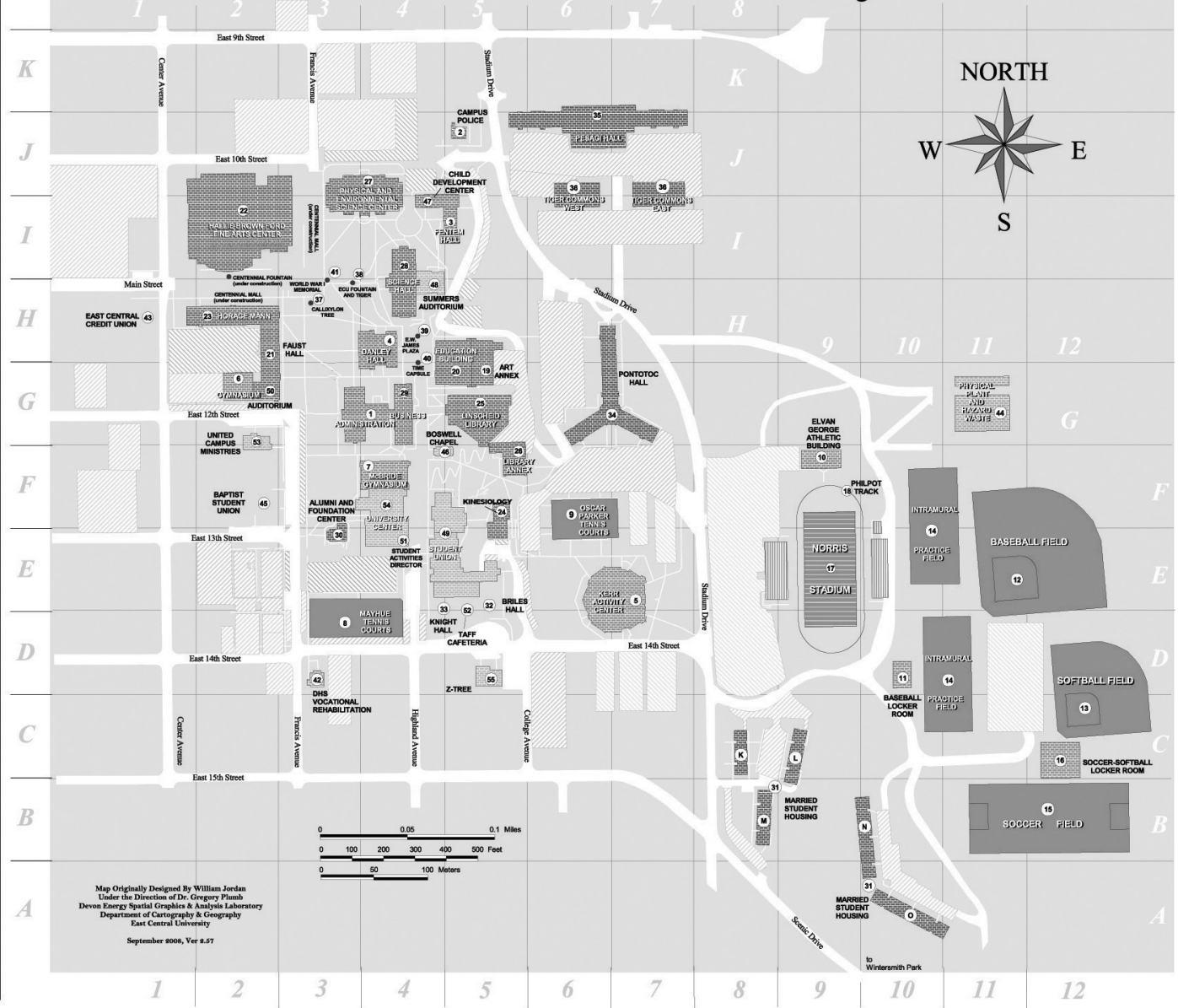
