## The beginning of a new era for ECU Tigers

Wendell Godwin became the 10th president of ECU on July 1, 2022, after a long career in the corporate world and more than a decade in academics, leading ECU's Harland C. Stonecipher School of Business, its faculty and its students, to levels of great achievement and national recognition.

Godwin earned his Business Administration degree in 1984 from ECU and his Executive MBA in 2005 from Southern Methodist University. He graduated from Pauls Valley High School in 1980.

In 2010, Godwin was named Dean of the School of Business and worked to transform the culture of the school of business into one of excellence.

He supported university efforts to raise \$14 million for the Chickasaw Business & Conference Center and the new building for the school of business.

Various programs were introduced as a result of additional fundraising efforts.
