ECU OFFERING TRAINING FOR 'GREEN JOBS'

A \$255,840 "Oklahoma Green" grant awarded to ECU, funded by the U.S. Department of Labor and administered by the Oklahoma Department

of Commerce, will train, certify and place up to 200 workers who will become eligible for "green jobs" in energy efficiency and renewable energy occupations.

The free courses will be offered throughout the year in Ada, Ardmore and Durant. The consortium includes ECU, the Southern Oklahoma Workforce Board, Chickasaw Nation Career Services, Dr. Green Energy, Byng and Ada Schools and Pontotoc Technology Ctr.
