

#### ECU GRADUATE ENROLLMENT CONTINUES TO CLIMB

This year ECU has more students than ever, but in the past five years the growth in the number of graduate students has outpaced everything. Graduate students now make up 1/5 of ECU's student population. During the past several semesters it was not



unusual for some graduate classes to max out on the first day of enrollment.

Why the increase? Some of this is due in part to the wide variety of graduate programs added at ECU. Currently, ECU offers 18 different master's options.

#### ECU SELECTED FOR "OKLAHOMA PROJECT GREEN" FUNDING

ECU is one of six Oklahoma workforce training programs selected for financial support in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) grant to train Oklahomans for careers in emerging "green" industries such as energy efficiency and renewable energy.

The Southern Oklahoma Green Jobs Consortium at ECU was awarded \$255,840. This will allow 200 participants to receive training with LEED Green Associate, Photovoltaic Systems Technology Technician, Weatherization Unemployed Worker or Weatherization Worker Enhancement.
