ECU SMASHES ENROLLMENT RECORD

ECU has a record enrollment this semester with 4,893 students, an increase of 6.3 percent over last fall.



This is also the highest enrollment in ECU's history. Residential housing is almost at 100 percent occupancy.

The free lecture also will mark the university's annual observance of Constitution Day, the day that commemorates Sept. 17, 1789, when the final draft of the U.S. Constitution was signed by members of the Constitutional Convention.

performance Saturday in the Tiger's 20-7 home loss to sixth-ranked Texas A&M Kingsville. Smith a junior from Deland, Fla., intercepted two passes which led to 77 yards in returns (one 72-yarder). He led ECU with nine tackles, including seven solo stops, and had a tackle for a lost yard.
