

#### STUDENTS TAKE TRIP TO NATCHEZ TRACE



A group of ECU Native American Studies students toured portions of the historical Natchez Trace, a near 440-mile path from Natchez, Miss., to Nashville, Tenn., in August. The

trace links the Cumberland and Mississippi Rivers and was created and used by Native Americans, particularly Chickasaws for centuries, for trade. The experience enabled the group to learn about the Chickasaw culture prior to the tribe's removal from its true homeland. ECU professors Dr. Tom Cowger, Dr. Scott Barton and instructor Laura Clark were among those who led the contingent.
