Transferring credit for general education does not eliminate or otherwise affect any of the following ECU requirements: (1) prerequisites;
 (2) specific requirements in majors, minors, or related work in these areas; or (3) the requirements for teacher certification. General Education equivalencies can be found by referring to either the Oklahoma State Regents Transfer Matrix or the ECU Transfer Matrix.
