⇒ A student transferring with an Associate degree in Arts or Science from EOSC fulfills ECU's general education requirement by transferring his or her credit to East Central University. Transferring credit for general education does not eliminate or otherwise affect any of the following ECU requirements: (1) prerequisites;
(2) specific requirements in majors, minors, or related work in these areas; or (3) the requirements for teacher certification. General Education equivalencies can be found by referring to either the Oklahoma State Regents Transfer Matrix or the ECU Transfer Matrix.
