WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE?

Legal Studies is more legally technical. If you wish to become a legal assistant, this is the major for you. Political Science is more conceptual, so people who love ideas or arguing about politics will feel more at home with this major. You can even major in one and minor in the other.

The Political Science and Legal Studies program has a 100% acceptance rate to law school since 2015. In the last 7 years, more than 30 students were accepted to over 40 law schools. There are currently 13 graduates in five different law schools across the country.

3+3 ECU+OCU College of Law

The Legal Studies program has an agreement with the Oklahoma City University School of Law to early admit qualified students when they are juniors. Students are able to save a full year of coursework and tuition.

Early Settlement Mediation

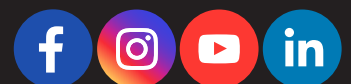

Political Science

Political Science majors emphasize critical thinking and written and oral communication skills. Classes are typically discussion-based and service learning and simulations are often employed. The Political Science program is dedicated to preparing students for future employment in government, business, law or the police academy. It is the perfect springboard to law school or graduate school. The Political Science program is dedicated to building political community through active learning, engaged citizenship and the promotion of democratic values.

Legal Studies
