Graduate education offers students the opportunity to build upon prior educational achievements to increase knowledge and related skills for career or personal goals.

Graduate courses assume students possess the commitments and academic skills necessary to approach increased levels of content mastery and application.

East Central University offers one doctoral degree, ten master degrees with ten options, two graduate certificates and four non-degree seeking pathways. These programs satisfy requirements for advanced and provisional Oklahoma teaching certificates, Licensed Professional Counseling and Certified Rehabilitation Counselor, as well as other credentials.

> Admission Requirements

The School of Graduate Studies processes applications for admission to Graduate Studies. Students may be granted concurrent, provisional, conditional, unconditional or non-degree seeking admission status.

A student seeking admission to a graduate program must:

1. Complete an application for admission to the university.
2. Submit transcripts and program documents required for admission to a particular Graduate Degree Program.
3. Develop a program of study in consultation with an assigned advisor.

Standards for Admission

1. Hold a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university.
2. Meet the academic admission requirements for the Graduate Degree Program (see individual graduate program requirements in the current graduate catalog).

> Online Programs

Rural Education (EdD): Designed to address and study rural education's unique circumstances and challenges.

Library Media (MEd): Designed for graduate students planning to become a School Library Media Specialist in grades PreK-12 in public or private educational settings.

Special Education (MEd): Designed for graduate students specializing in teaching students with mild/moderate disabilities in PreK-12th grade.

Educational Leadership (MEd): Designed for graduate students specializing in administration for grades K-12.

Sports Administration (MEd): Designed to prepare the professional director for positions such as Head Coach, Athletic Director, or other administrative positions responsible for directing athletic programs.

Water Resource Policy and Management (MSWRPM): Trains students for leadership in making water policy decisions and prepares students who seek employment within federal and state environmental agencies.

> On-Ground and Mixed Programs

Education Specialist (EdS): Focus of the program will be equipping professionals by training them in the areas of assessment, consultation, special education law and academic/behavioral intervention.

Biological Sciences [Health Sciences] (MS): Designed to strengthen the scientific portfolio and provide specialized preparation for those individuals seeking careers in the health industry, water science, ecology, or the natural sciences.

Business Administration (MBA): Designed to provide working professionals with the knowledge and abilities necessary to further their careers in executive, managerial, and administrative roles in business, healthcare, state and local government entities, tribal governments, and nonprofit organizations.

Counseling Psychology (MSPS): Focuses on the skills and knowledge needed to facilitate personal and interpersonal functioning within mental health practice and different community mental health settings.

Management (MiM): Degree targets students whose first degree is outside a business field or who have a degree in a business field, but would like to enhance their knowledge of business.

School Counseling (MEd): Designed for graduate students specializing in counseling at the elementary or secondary level and leads to the Master of Education Degree.

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Accounting (MSA): Designed to provide an educational experience which will prepare students to successfully complete all portions of the Certified Public Accountant (CPA) exam, while earning an advanced degree.

Biological Sciences [Water Sciences] (MS): Designed to strengthen the scientific portfolio and provide specialized preparation for those individuals seeking careers in the health industry, water science, ecology, or the natural sciences.

Criminal Justice Administration (MA): Will prepare students for roles as police chiefs, assistant or deputy chiefs, sheriffs, under-sheriffs, wardens, deputy wardens, and chief agents of law enforcement entities.

Clinical Mental Health Counseling (MS): This degree prepares counseling professionals for employment in a variety of public and private settings.

School Psychometry (MEd): Focuses on the applied knowledge needed in the development and use of educational and testing skills for student assessment.

Sport Psychology (MSPS): Focuses on the applied knowledge needed in the development and use of psychological skills for the optimal performance and the well-being of athletes.
