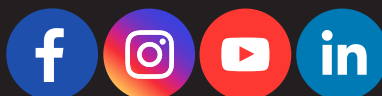

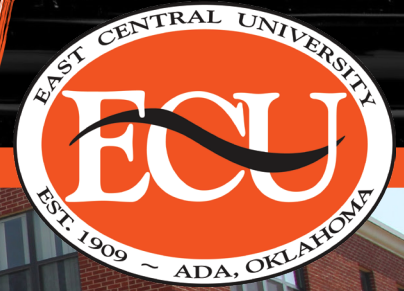

## Psychology

As a field, psychology attempts to develop technologies that will help understand the dynamics of human behavior to help promote human welfare. As such, the undergraduate program at East Central University prepares its students through classwork, student professional organizations such as Psi Chi, field trips, assisting the faculty in professional endeavors such as research and application, and close relationships with the faculty to help understand and get to know, on a broad basis, the field of psychology. This training prepares the student to work entry-level positions in the following areas:

### Behavioral Health Concentration

This option is designed to offer an educational experience for those interested in working in a behavioral health-related field. As a discipline, it attempts to provide the initial educational background for students who are seeking to be employed in the area of mental health upon the completion of their bachelor's degree.
