Do I need to be an ECU student to apply to the nursing program? – NO

Are the applications to ECU and the Nursing Program separate? - YES

How do I apply to ECU? - You will have to apply to ECU thru the portal.

When can I apply to the nursing program?

- a. Application materials for admission to a spring semester must be received by November 1st @ 5pm CST
- b. Application materials for admission to a fall semester must be received by June 1st @ 5pm CST

When will I be notified of the admissions decisions for the nursing program?

Admission decision letters will be sent out approximately four weeks from the application cycle closing date. Letters will be sent to the email address provided on your nursing application.

How much does it cost to attend ECU and the nursing program?

Do I need to take an Entrance Exam for the nursing program? – NO

What are the eligibility requirements to be considered for admission into the nursing program?

- Have graduated from an OK LPN Program
- Meet all nursing deadlines and material requirements; following the process as instructed
- Meet ECU Admission requirements and be accepted to ECU by the nursing deadlines
- Provide all college/university transcripts, to include your LPN Program transcript showing successful completion
- Have a valid, unencumbered OK/MSL LPN license prior to starting the program
- Upon admission to the nursing program, you are expected to complete/maintain all remaining requirements related to the program, clinical, attestations, and accreditation, to include attending the mandatory cohort orientation. Failure to

complete/maintain and/all requirements may result in a withdraw of acceptance and/or dismissal from the program.

- Ged Ed & nursing required related work courses taken prior to starting the program, in which a “D” has been earned will be accepted. Upon acceptance, all additional required gen eds & related work must be passed with a grade of “C” or higher.

What happens if I do not get a requirement completed in time after being accepted to the program?

You will forfeit your position in the accepted cohort

Does the nursing program have an alternate list?

YES – Decision letters on those selected for the alternate list are sent out in the same time period as the acceptance letters

Will I be notified if I am not accepted to join the program or as an alternate?

YES – Decision letters on those not selected for admission to the program, or placement on the alternate list are sent out in the same time period as the acceptance letters

Do I need to send transcripts to both ECU and the School of Nursing? – YES

- a. You must submit a transcript from your LPN program (unofficial are acceptable) WITH your application. If you have not completed the program upon applying, please submit one showing your progress. You will need to submit an official transcript to the SON prior to the start of the semester.
- b. You MUST submit at LEAST unofficial transcripts showing final grades, from EACH university/college you have attended **WITH** {AT THE SAME TIME} as your nursing application.
- c. You must also send in a course schedule or transcript showing enrollment in any courses you are currently taking
- d. Official transcripts sent to the SoN will be required if accepted, and you will be given a deadline for these in your admission packet

How are admission decisions made?

The application scoring rubric itself is not published. Applications are scored on a number of factors to include, but not limited to:

1. GPA {Grad Retention and Program}
2. Required Gen Ed and Required Related Work course grades
3. Number of times a course is repeated
4. ECU Residency with completed college credits
5. Prior degrees earned
6. Relative experience
7. Licensures and Certifications {with copies provided}
8. Reflective Statement responses
9. Submission of all application materials in a complete and correct manner

What Required Gen Ed and Required Related Work courses do I need to have completed, or be enrolled in when I apply to the nursing program?

The courses below must be completed for you to be eligible to graduate, along with any additional required general education and nursing courses. All the required gen eds, nursing required related work, nursing courses must be passed with a “C” or higher. Courses previously taken with a grade below a “C” may be approved by the Director, SoN. It is highly beneficial for you to complete the science courses early on, as it will become increasingly difficult to fit them into schedule as you move forward. We also recommend that you complete the Math course early on.

1. English Composition I
2. English Composition II
3. Functions & Modeling OR College Algebra
4. General Biology {W/ Lab}
5. Chemical Principles OR General Chemistry {W/ Lab}
6. General Psychology
- *. Human Anatomy is articulated for credit
7. Human Physiology {W/ Lab}
8. Epidemiology OR Microbiology (W/ Lab)
9. Basic Nutrition
10. Developmental Psychology
11. 3-credit computer course
12. Statistics

*You are STRONGLY encourage to use the Transfer Matrix and ensure that the course you are taking, or planning on taking, equates to the required course at ECU. There are some courses taken at 2-year colleges and/or out of state colleges that do not transfer, and cannot be substituted. Course evaluation through ECU will not be completed until you are enrolled and attending classes at ECU.

What program and clinical requirements will I need?

1. CPR – MUST be American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers
 2. Background Check & Urine Drug Screen {To be done after you are accepted}
 3. Immunizations/Vaccinations
 - Tetanus, Diphtheriae, & Pertussis (Tdap) – given within the last 10 years
 - Measles, Mumps, & Rubella (MMR)
 - Varicella (Chicken Pox)
 - Hepatitis B Series
 - COVID-19
 - Tuberculin (TB/PPD) Skin Test – Two-Step for initial, and then annually **OR** QuantiFERON gold blood test **OR** Negative TSpot blood test
- *If previous or current positive test results, a Clearance of Public Contact from the Health Department

This list is subject to change if/as the requirements of our clinical sites change. A detailed list can be found as part of the application packet. If you attend to apply, you are strongly encouraged to begin working on these things NOW, as some of them make take time to complete.

Where will the clinical rotations be, and will I have to commute?

Our clinical coordinator will request information from you during your first semester to assist in clinical placement for the semesters to follow. You will need to ensure you list if you are an athlete, involved in a club, etc., as well as any other pertinent information.

We will always work at placing you where your commute is not long and at a location, date, and time you prefer, but – please understand that you may NOT get these things, for a number of reasons.

Can I car pool to clinical, lab, and/or class?

The expectation is that you will have a reliable method of transportation, and the ability to get yourself to and from classes, labs, and clinicals. We cannot base placement on someone's need to ride with a friend. If your friend is not able to attend class for an exam, or go to a clinical one day, for example, your absence would not be excused, and you may not be allowed a make-up because you did not have transportation. Rescheduling a missed lab, clinical, or exam can be very difficult to do, so please keep that in mind. Non-attendance for any portion of the program can impact your ability to be successful.

Are there options of days/times available for when the nursing courses and labs can be taken?

Currently, we are only offering one section of each course. The courses cannot be taken out of sequence. For example – you cannot take Pharmacology II in your first semester of the program.
