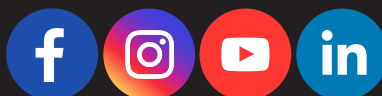
The Department of Professional Programs in Human Services offers educational programs that share the common goal of preparing students to work with people in a variety of human services agencies and organizations. The human services field is one of the most rapidly expanding career fields in America today. The department of Professional Programs in Human Services focuses on those careers which require professional preparation and training for service to individuals, families, groups and the community. Degree programs include Human Services Counseling, Criminal Justice and Social Work. In addition to a general career field, the Counseling student may select a concentration in Rehabilitation.

### > Human Services Counseling

The primary objective of the Human Services Counseling degree is to prepare students for entry-level human services positions in a variety of government, civic, private, and not-for-profit community based agencies and organizations. These agencies focus on the needs of people experiencing a variety of issues, including individual adjustment issues, person with disabilities, physical and mental problems, drug or alcohol, and aging-related concerns and job-seeking problems. Client groups to be served range from youth and minorities to those in crisis situations. This curriculum provides the knowledge and skills needed for prevention and problem solving with both individuals and groups. Students gain practical experience through completion of an internship in the area of the students' interest.
