## > Human Services Counseling

The primary objective of the Human Services Counseling degree is to prepare students for entry-level human services positions in a variety of government, civic, private, and not-for-profit community based agencies and organizations. These agencies focus on the needs of people experiencing a variety of issues, including individual adjustment issues, person with disabilities, physical and mental problems, drug or alcohol, and aging-related concerns and job-seeking problems. This curriculum provides the knowledge and skills needed for prevention and problem solving with both individuals and groups. Students gain practical experience through completion of an internship in the area of the students' interest.

#### Concentration in Counseling


