

Within the Art Program, students can pursue a bachelor of fine arts with concentrations offered in Studio Art, Art Education and Graphic Design. The concentration in Studio Art prepares students for positions as an artist or for further study in fine arts graduate programs.

Media + Communication prepares students for careers in media industries, government, business, or to enter graduate programs by offering two concentrations and two minors to students committed to the study of mass media and strategic communication.
