After discussing your project with your project advisor, type the requested information into the downloaded form and email him or her a final draft of your proposal. When the project advisor has approved the proposal, he or she will e-mail it to the Honors Director and copy the student on that email. The Honors Director will email an evaluation report to the student and the project advisor after the Honors Board has reviewed the proposal.

- 1) Identify and describe the nature of your engagement. Consider length of assignment, type of engagement, activities, research questions, supplemental readings, e-mail correspondence, journals, etc. Typically, an Honors engagement experience should be comparable in length to a 15-week course requiring 45 hours of seat time in addition to homework and other work completed outside of class. If you are getting course credit for this internship, what work you will be doing beyond the requirements of the traditional syllabus?
- 2) How will this project benefit you as you seek further education or employment in your chosen field?
- 3) What evaluation criteria will be used throughout and upon completion of the engagement? Typically, students keep journals during their engagement experience, read and write about five recently published academic sources relevant to their experience, and write a final reflection paper in which they integrate discussion of their experience and the knowledge acquired through their research. Faculty mentors read and respond to the journal entries, pose questions for further reflection and research, help students find relevant sources, and provide guidance and feedback on the final reflection paper.
