

ECU HOUSING AND RESIDENCE LIFE CONTRACT SUMMER 2026

You have applied for summer housing with East Central University, which will commence June 1, 2026 to July 24, 2026. All summer housing residents will reside in Briles Hall. The cost for the summer contract will be \$750.00 for a double room/shared bath, \$1050.00 for a single room/shared bath (limited availability), and \$1150.00 for a single room/private bath (limited availability). Students with summer contracts and currently living in Student Housing at the end of the Spring 2026 semester will remain in their current assignments until summer accommodations are ready for occupancy. Key pick-up and check-ins will occur between May 27, 2026 - May 29, 2026. All residents must vacate no later than July 26, 2026 at 5 pm.

All Summer 2026 residents are required to be enrolled in a minimum of 3 credit hours for the Summer Session. There will be no exceptions considered to this guideline. If at any point during the Summer 2026 semester a student drops or withdraws from all courses they will be expected to vacate their housing assignment within 48 hours.

All students residing on campus for the Summer 2026 session are required to maintain a meal plan. Residents may choose between two available options to best suit their needs: 14 meal per week plan (\$990) or 10 meal per week plan (\$784). In the event that a meal plan is not selected during the application process the 14 meal per week plan (\$990) will automatically be applied to the resident's account. The final day to make any changes to your selection is May 29, 2026 at 4pm CST. Once the session begins on June 1, 2026, meal plan changes will no longer be accepted. Dining services will officially commence on June 1, 2026, and conclude on July 24, 2026. Please note that while early move-in is permitted from May 27–29, 2026, dining facilities will remain closed during this period. Residents arriving before June 1, 2026 are responsible for providing their own meals until service begins.

East Central University reserves the right to deny, cancel or remove from housing, any individual who provides false information as part of the application process, individuals with a documented history of violent behavior, and/or behavior that demonstrates an inability to function within the campus housing environment of East Central University. We further reserve the right to verify any information provided by the applicant that is available through public records. All students residing in the residence halls must be able to provide for their own safety, including the ability to follow all campus policies and procedures in the event of an emergency situation and/or evacuation. Students residing in the residence halls are required to participate in emergency response and evacuation drills. Students are required to evacuate the residence hall in the event of a fire alarm and/or during any evacuation led by residence hall staff to ensure the safety of all students.

The University reserves the right to enter your room at any time to investigate/address any health, safety, maintenance, and/or damage inspection of the premises is warranted or is deemed necessary for an institutional-purpose search.

Although precautions are taken to maintain the facilities and adequate security, the University does not carry property insurance. The student and his/her parent or legal guardian are strongly encouraged to carry appropriate insurance, including renter's insurance, to cover any loss of personal property. Residents are responsible for any damages that occur in their assigned room or hall. Person(s) responsible for damages in the room(s) or public areas will be billed for the cost of repair/replacement. If damage occurs in common areas, and the individual(s) responsible cannot be identified, the floor, wing or hall community may be charged for replacement, repair, or cleaning.
