


We also have over 200 die cuts available and will be glad to cut and send to you or you are welcome to come cut them yourself. Let us know colors and number needed.


### LENDING LIBRARY

#### Remember, we are here to assist you!

November 30, 2022, was the deadline for applying for recertification in the new QRIS (Quality Rating Improvement System) implementation. Note: providers can still apply for Stars or Stars increases; however, the incentive option is no longer available.

The past five months have been busy ones for providers and coaches alike, but it was worth the effort as nearly 2900 providers statewide made applications for participation in Stars. Although many providers are awaiting their Needs Assessments, many of those who submitted by the deadline have already received word of their approval.

Coaching and TA will not cease as Lindsay, Georgiana, and Angel continue to be available to assist you in satisfying your Needs Assessment requirements. ### A LETTER FROM MISTI DENTON

Good afternoon providers,

I want to take a moment and introduce myself and the OKDHS QRIS team as well as inform you of the monitoring plan for the Stars program in 2023.

My name is Misti Denton and I am the new QRIS Program Administrator. I have been with DHS for 23 years and 18 of those years have been spent in Child Care Services. I look forward to serving in this new role. At the bottom of this email is the QRIS team breakdown and contact information.

Our team has been very busy processing Stars applications and requests for certifications during this re-launch period. We are pleased to announce that we have processed close to 2,500 Stars applications and there are a little over 400 programs who are new to QRIS! It is so exciting to know so many of you have made the commitment to provide high quality child care to the children of this state. I'm sure everyone can agree with me when I say that the goal is for ALL children to have access to quality child care. We want all programs to be successful in meeting this goal.

Therefore in 2023, the Star monitoring reviews will be an opportunity for licensing to review the Stars criteria with you. This will be a time for consulting and providing resources when needed. The Stars monitoring reviews will be discussion visits only and criteria violations will not be documented. Numerous, repeated or serious non-compliances with minimum licensing requirements will be documented for the last 24 months. We believe giving grace over the next year will give you time to truly understand and implement the Stars criteria. The expectation is that all criteria will be met by January 2024 when full monitoring will resume.

If you did not get your Stars application or request for certification submitted during the re-application period, you can still submit a request for a higher Star level at any time. Please note your request may not be processed or reviewed until March 1, 2023. This will allow us time to finish processing all requests received during the re-application period.
