Marilyn was an English education major and probably the happiest person I have ever met she always had a smile on her face and a kind word for anyone she saw. She was so excited about teaching high school and using her degree and starting her career as a teacher.

Marilyn and I came from similar backgrounds; we were both the first in our families to receive degrees and we both came from low-income households. Marilyn worked after classes and on weekends for the Ada Evening News to put herself through school. For Marilyn, getting an education and becoming a teacher was her life's goal. She felt she was being an example for her two younger sisters and worked hard to stay on the honor role. And in 1979, she graduated with a degree in English education and a minor in journalism "with honors". In 1980, Marilyn and I married and began our wonderful 43-year journey together.

Marilyn was always a big supporter of education, and during her life she wished she could do something for students to make their education goals obtainable. But life happens and the money wasn't there to donate. So, she was content to encourage as many people as she could to go to school and give advice and support when she could. I couldn't make her dream come true in life so it became my and our two sons' goal to do something in her name to help students. With the help of the wonderful people at the East Central University Foundation we established the "**Marilyn E. Ray Balch Memorial Scholarship**" to help low-income, first-generation students obtain an English or English education degree. I hope this little bit of help will make the students' journey at East Central an easier path to walk and hopefully make their time as happy and enjoyable as ours was.

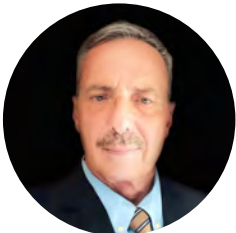

FRANKIE CRAWFORD

DISTINGUISHED ALUM 2024



East Central University alumnus, Frankie Crawford is a 1985 graduate of ECU who received his bachelor's degree in Accounting. He left ECU as a four-year letterman for the university's tennis team, former president of the ECU Presidential Leadership Class and a two-time host of Tiger Tangles.

“My first reaction when President Godwin called me to inform me of my selection as a distinguished alumni was that he must have the wrong Frankie Crawford,” Crawford stated when asked about the honor. “Once he convinced me that he had the correct guy (President Godwin and I were at ECU at the same time), I was initially shocked, humbled, and excited that the University that I have always considered my second home would honor me in such a fashion.”

Following his time at ECU, Crawford pursued accounting and has dedicated nearly 40 years of his career to Crawford & Associates, P.C. where he currently serves as President. The firm specializes in providing auditing, consulting and accounting services solely to government entities and is a member of the AICPA and the AICPA Government Audit Quality Center.

Crawford was recognized as a recipient of the U.S. Graduate Schools “2010 Instructor Excellence Award,” a recipient of the Association of Government Accountants 2014 Private Sector Financial Excellence Award, he served a term as Chairman of the AICPA Government Expert Panel and is currently the Chairman of the Oklahoma Society of CPAs Government Accounting and Auditing Committee. He has also been involved in a number of other AICPA committees and task forces as they relate to governmental accounting and auditing. In 2015, Mr. Crawford completed a 4-year term as Chairman of the AICPA's annual Government and Not-For-Profit Training Conference after serving on the Planning Task Force of the Conference for 18 years.

“I certainly didn't set out on a path to distinguish myself from anybody,” stated Crawford. “I was just looking for a place to further my education, provide me life skills that I knew I would need one day to provide for my future family, and of course have fun while doing it. I found all those things and more at ECU, as the University basically adopted me into their family, and in return, I have tried over the years to return that kindness and treat the University as part of my family.”

Crawford has maintained a strong relationship with ECU since his graduation. He served four years on the ECU Alumni Board, including one year as the president/chairman, a four-year term on the ECU Foundation Board, and has guest lectured for the ECU accounting club and accounting classes.

Since 1992, Crawford's company has maintained an annual monetary Crawford & Associates Scholarship to an ECU student majoring in Accounting, along with a summer internship in many of those years.

DUANE MURRAY

DISTINGUISHED ALUM 2024



Duane Murray is a 1972 graduate of ECU who received his Bachelor of Science in Mathematics with a minor in Computer Science.

As an undergraduate, Murray participated in the Honors Program, worked as a computer lab assistant, served as president of the Delta Chi fraternity and married Linda Durham in 1969.

“ECU was formative in my life. I met the mother of my children there, made lifelong friends there, and got the educational background I needed to succeed in business.” said Murray.

After ECU, Murray chose to remain a part of the Ada community and began his career by starting Computer Utility Corporation, one of the first Apple computer stores in Oklahoma. In 1982, Duane established Computel, which was the only way to get discounted long distance telephone service in Ada, at the time. In 1988 Duane sold both companies and joined Moon-Baker Agency as a commercial insurance

agent. In 1999, he established the Murray/Wamble Insurance Agency in Tulsa, which sold in 2023.

Murray has served as board member and legislative chairman for the Ada Chamber of Commerce where he worked to establish the Ada Softball Association and ran the City of Ada softball program for ten years. He also worked with the city of Ada to write a federal grant application that helped fund the four fields built at Matthews Park. In 1976 he was named the Oklahoma Softball Association Commissioner of the Year and was inducted into the Oklahoma Softball Hall of Fame in 2006. In 1989, he also founded the Ada Youth Baseball Association and oversaw the Harry Brecheen youth baseball field that same year.

Throughout the years, Murray has served as President of the Ada Kiwanis, First United Methodist Church of Ada Finance Committee and President and Board member of Southern Oklahoma Addiction Recovery. He has also been a member of the ECU Tip-In Booster Club, ECU President’s Circle and the ECU Foundation.

To honor his late wife, who graduated from ECU in 1989 with a degree in music as well as a master’s degree in Flute from the University of Oklahoma in 1992, the Linda Murray Flute scholarship at ECU was endowed by Duane in 2013.

In 2021 he established and, with community help, endowed the ECU Information Technology Scholarship.

Murray has three sons, Sean, Zac and Scott. In 2022 Duane married retired ECU Associate Professor, Dr. Marty Pennington.

DR. JUDYLEE OLIVA

DISTINGUISHED ALUM 2024



Dr. JudyLee Oliva is a 1975 graduate of ECU who received her bachelor's degree in Speech and Theatre Education.

“From ECU, I not only learned about my craft, but I also learned about myself, my work ethic and my artistic point of view,” Oliva said. “I had professors who cared about me as a student, but also, who cared about me as a human being who had dreams, along with my goals. Especially Dr. Dorothy Summers who was head of the theatre program at ECU and Professor Margaret Nims, who taught Creative Writing.”

Oliva would further her education by earning her MFA at the University of Oklahoma and her PhD at Northwestern University in Evanston, Ill. Her education in theatre, drama and directing would provide the foundation for the accomplishments that would come.

Professionally, Oliva has found success in a number of fields including contributions to scholarly publications, scholarship presentations, playwriting, directing and a wide range of awards and honors. She was also professor of theatre at Stony Brook University in NY, Northern Illinois University and the University of Tennessee, teaching courses in Playwriting, Acting and Theatre History.

Oliva has published a number of scholarly works in books, essays, articles and interviews including chapters and articles featured in “Performing Dreams into Being: Native American Women’s Theater,” “Journal to Dramatic Theory and Criticism,” “Contemporary Women Dramatists” and many more.

She was named the Dynamic Chickasaw Woman of 2006, received the First Book Award for Prose by Native Writers Circle of Americas, was named the winner of the Five Civilized Tribes Best American Indian Musical Play for “Te Ata,” the winner of the 1987 Agnes Nixon Playwriting Competition for “See Jane Run”. Additionally, she was the winner of the Women Playwrights Initiative Competition in 2004 for “99¢ Dreams,” among many other honors and accomplishments.

Oliva continues to make significant professional contributions. In 2021, she served as a guest lecturer for Native American Theatre at Stanford University. The following year she was a judge for the Miss Oklahoma Pageant. Currently, she is working on the children’s book “I Can Hear the Corn Grow,” an upcoming anthology of Native American plays and her most recent play, “Porcelain Apostles.”

CHRIS FEILER

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE 2024



Chris Feiler is a 1980 graduate of ECU where he was an active member of the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity and received his bachelor's degree in Education.

“It is a privilege to be recognized by East Central University in this capacity,” said Feiler.

He began his career in customer service in 1975 at Black's Men's and Ladies' Wear in Ada, where he worked while attending ECU. Now, with 49 years of customer and community service experience, Feiler's passion for his community still continues today in his current role as Public Relations Officer of Citizens Bank of Ada.

Feiler's dedication to serving others goes beyond his role with Citizens Bank of Ada, however.

He has practiced volunteerism for 43 years as a counselor at Goddard Youth Camp, served as a deacon at First Baptist Church, and has spent many years serving on a number of boards of directors, such as United Way, the ECU Alumni Association and the Ada Area Chamber of Commerce, where he continues to serve today.

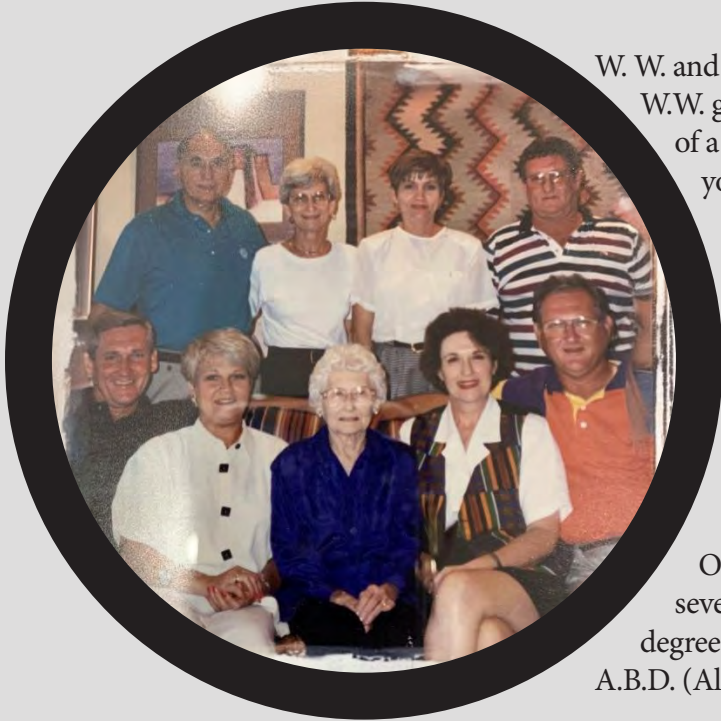

W. W. and Billie Stephenson were longtime residents of Ada, OK. W.W. grew up in Atwood. He was the sixth of nine children, the son of a peanut and pig farmer. Billie grew up in Allen and was the youngest of four children of the local doctor.

W.W. and Billie had four children, Gene, Suella, Dickie and Jon. They also had eleven grandchildren Dr. Amy Stephenson Patterson, Thomas Stephenson, Michele Mayes Webel, Stephen Mayes, Casey Stephenson Hunter, Shawn Stephenson, Jamie Lowry, Christy Stephenson Livermore, Angie Stephenson Crawford, Ashley Stephenson Harward and Jon W. Stephenson, Jr.

Of the fifteen family members, there are two Ph.D.'s, one J.D., seven master's degrees (two of which are CPAs) and five bachelor's degrees. If the spouses of the family are included, there is also one A.B.D. (All But Dissertation), five master's and six bachelor's degrees.

Gene and his wife, Lynda, were fixtures on the ECU faculty and administration for 25 years. Gene was a member of the Mathematics Department and Vice-President of Academic Affairs for 10 years. Lynda taught English and started new classes in Humanities and Film Appreciation. In 1990, Gene retired from ECU and became the President of the University of the Ozarks. As the Ozarks First Lady, Lynda supervised the decoration of five new buildings on campus.

Suella and her husband, Wayne Mayes, met at ECU. After graduating, they moved to New Mexico where she worked as a medical technologist and Wayne served as the State Supervisor of Office and Business Education for the State of New Mexico. They later moved to Cincinnati, Ohio where she was a Public-School Librarian, and he was Vice-President of Southwestern Publishing.

Dickie graduated from ECU with his bachelor's and master's degrees and became a public-school teacher. He was head football coach at both Ada High School and Ada Junior High School and later became manager of the W.W. Stephenson Petroleum Corporation. Dickie has since passed away, along with his first wife, Kathy Kirkhoff Stephenson, and second wife, Nema Etier Stephenson.

The youngest sibling, Jon, graduated from ECU with a degree in Mathematics. While an undergraduate, Jon met and married Cheryl Martin. Cheryl was a member of the choir, and she won first place in Tiger Tangles as a student. Jon was a quarterback on the Tigers Football Team. After receiving his master's degree at OSU, Jon returned to ECU as an Instructor in the Accounting Department. He later helped form the accounting firm of Lamb, Stephenson, Buxton, and Davidson. He became President of Home Federal Savings and Loan of Ada and eventually Executive Vice-President of Commercial Federal Bank in Omaha, NE. Jon also served as President of the ECU Alumni Association.

WAYS TO GIVE

Gifts to the Foundation, a 501(c)3 non profit organization under the IRS code, are tax-deductible to the extent of the law and can be used as a tax-saving tool.



GIFTS OF CASH

These gifts are always welcome because they are available immediately to strengthen the University or begin earning income for the future.



GIFTS OF SECURITIES

These gifts include stocks, bonds, mutual funds, and IRAs, and also are available immediately to impact the work of the Foundation.



GIFTS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY

Personal property can include coin collections, antique cars, gun collections, artwork, etc.



GIFTS OF REAL PROPERTY

Real estate, homes, business property and farmland that has grown in value can result in tax advantages through a charitable gift to the Foundation.



GIFTS OF TRUSTS

This can include charitable remainder trusts, unitrusts, lead trusts, family trusts, annuity trusts, etc., which can avoid capital gains taxes and provide an annual income for life.



GIFTS OF BEQUESTS

At a donor's death, gifts directed by a will or a living trust are deducted from the most highly taxed portion of the donor's estate, resulting in less taxes and a larger distribution of the estate to the heirs. This is perhaps the most basic and flexible of estate planning instruments.



GIFTS OF INSURANCE

By assigning ownership to the Foundation or making the Foundation the beneficiary of a life insurance policy that is no longer needed for its original purpose (such as sheltering children's education), a donor can make a substantial gift at a low cost and take an immediate income tax deduction for the value of the policy. A donor then can contribute an amount equal to the policy's premiums to the Foundation and deduct that gift as a charitable contribution. Proceeds of the policy will pass to the Foundation free of estate taxes.

PRESIDENT'S CIRCLE

President's Circle is an exclusive group of individuals and businesses who provide targeted support for the advancement of East Central University.

This important group provides the University and the President with access to non-designated funds that can be used to enhance educational experiences and opportunities for students, faculty and staff.

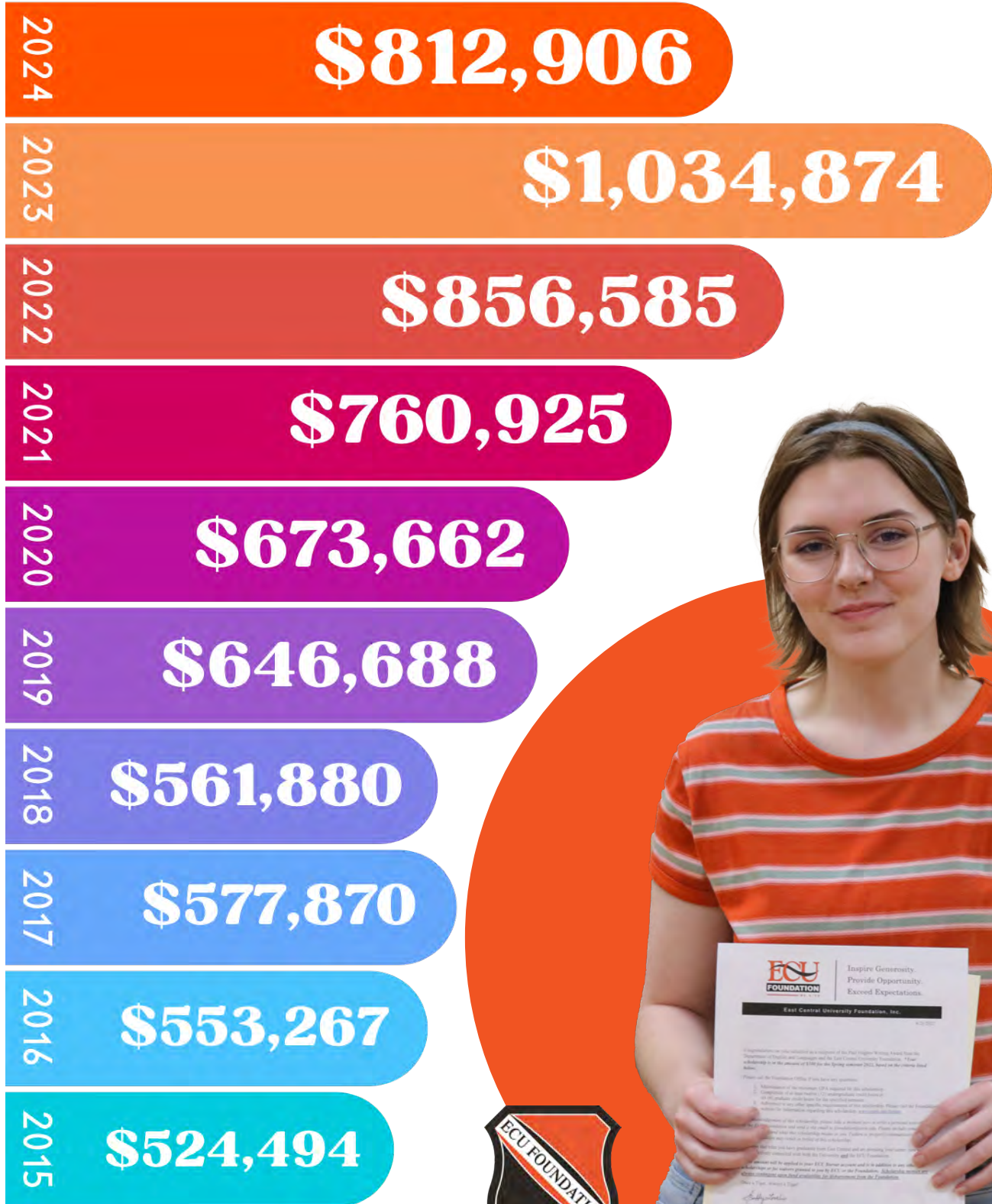

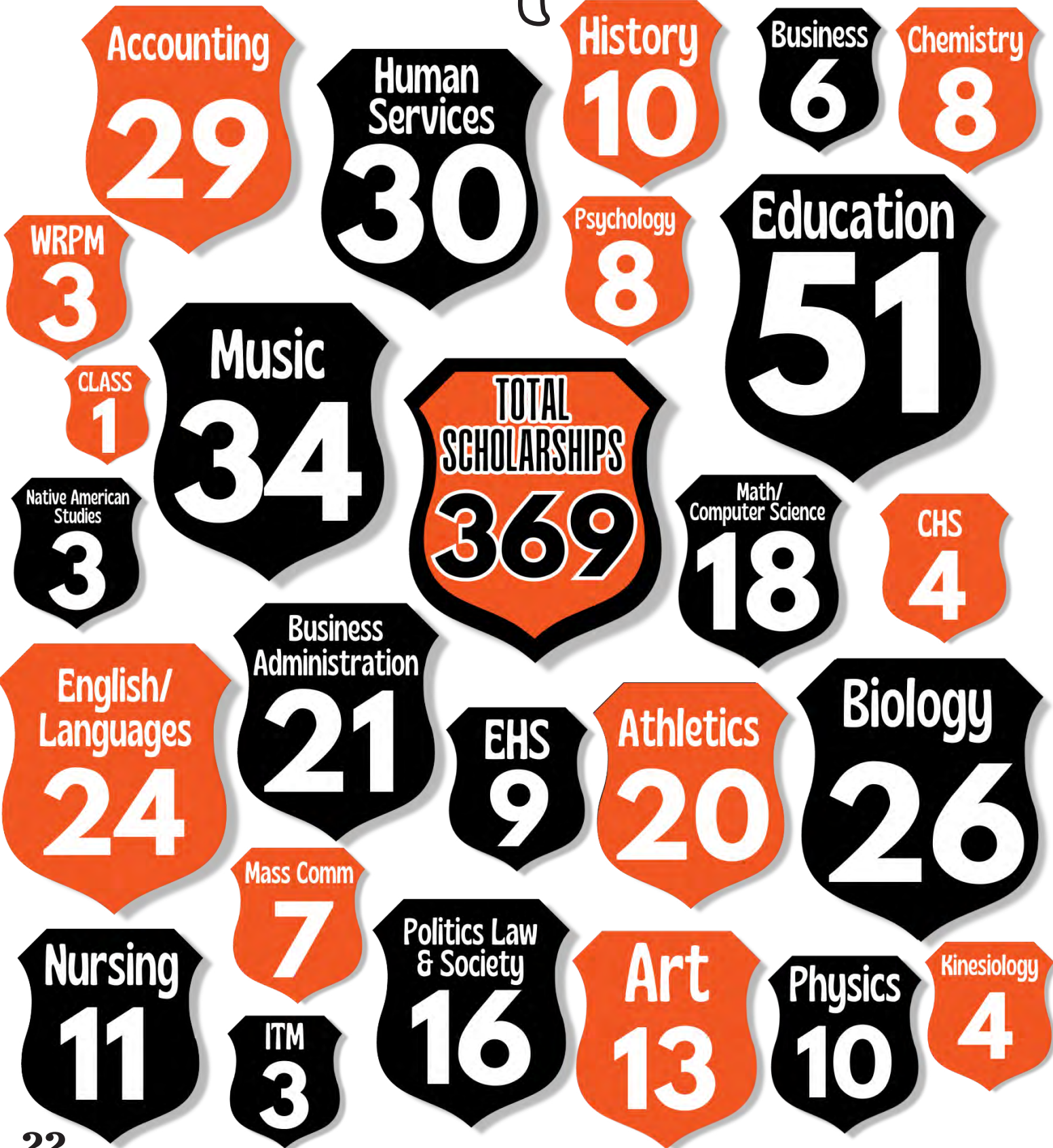

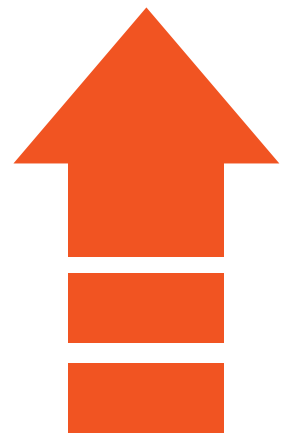
