

Impacts

Improved Diets

Your donations allowed our Enactus team to establish 77 Poultry enterprises in the villages of the Katikamu Sub County near Kampala in Uganga. As a result, thousand of villagers have improved their protein intake.

Improved Incomes

Villagers have seen increased incomes, which have allowed them improve their standard of living, send kids to school, build homes, and started additional businesses.

Improved Health

Forty (40) of our project participants are AIDS patients who had struggled to stay healthy because of poor diet. The increased protein intake supplemented their medications. As a result, they are healtier today.




Your donation is changing lives



The latest phase of our project involves the construction of a 200 Metric Tons dry grain storage facility. This storage facility will allow the villagers to reduce postharvest losses and acquire grain during harvest season for use during the off-season.

We still need help to complete the building. Stone, rebar, lumber, etc., must be acquired to complete this structure.









While we have achieved tremendous impacts with your donations, a project of this kind is never complete until the beneficiaries can take care of themselves. Therefore, self-sufficiency has been our ultimate goal. Thanks to your support, we have restored hope and a sense of purpose amount Ugandan villagers. They now see the future in a more positive light. They can feed themselves, send their children to school, build their own homes and even start a new business.

During our trip, we uncovered new issues they are facing, which would be resolved by structuring the beneficiaries into a cooperative after evaluation. In addition, we were fortunate to meet with the District Agricultural Officer, who promised government support to these villagers through agricultural extension.

Our new goal is to help structure the farmers into a cooperative so they can take advantage of the Ugandan government's assistance. We also aim to help them complete the construction of their dry grain storage facility and assist with additional training.
