Hospitality & Event Management

The Hospitality Industry includes careers working with hotels, restaurants, vacation destinations, sports teams, music concerts, cruise ships, casinos, theme parks and more. Coursework in this concentration prepares students for a broad range of careers where they will serve and entertain people. Certificates in Hospitality & Tourism and Event Planning are included when taking coursework in this concentration.

Food Science

Within the Food Science concentration, students combine biology and chemistry science coursework with the management side of our Hospitality programming and the people skills from Human Development.
