## > DEGREE OPTIONS

### Bachelor of Science in Music

The ECU Music Program has a unique and important role to play in Oklahoma music. Graduates can be found throughout the state and beyond employed as band and choral directors, music teachers, performers, composers, and music scholars. A Bachelor of Science in Music prepares students for a variety of careers including performance, accompanying, studio teaching and composition arranging. A Bachelor of Science in Music with Teaching Certificate and a Bachelor of Science in Music with Electives in Business are also available.



### Theatre

The Theatre concentration prepares students interested in acting, technical theatre, theatre criticism and scholarship, and theatre management to enter those fields. This concentration requires study and work in all aspects of theatre. Theatre majors prepare main stage productions and support an active studio theatre season, including ECU Theatre productions.



### Musical Theatre

The Musical Theatre concentration prepares students to enter Musical Theatre. Majors study acting, movement, voice, and develop skills and professional attitudes while learning about both theoretical and practical aspects of the field.
