### HUNDREDS FLOCK TO CAMPUS FOR ADAFEST





### DR. ANDERSON SET FOR INDUCTION INTO HIGHER EDUCATION HALL OF FAME



ECU provost emeritus Dr. Duane Anderson will be inducted into the Oklahoma Higher Education Hall of Fame on Nov. 4. Anderson served ECU for 25 years, retiring as provost and vice president for Academic Affairs. He also served as interim president of ECU during its centennial year of 2009. He presided and oversaw the creation of brick gates, located at the main entrances to the campus, along with establishing Centennial Endowments and Scholarships, which far exceeded goals.

### ALUM PERRY EARNS PRESTIGIOUS TV GOLD CIRCLE AWARD



ECU alum Bill Perry, vice president of Content Production at the Oklahoma Educational Television Authority (OETA), was recently inducted into the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences (NATAS) Heartland Emmy chapter's Gold Circle Society of Honor. The Gold Circle is an elite group of professionals recognized by the Emmy Heartland Chapter for making a significant contribution to television, spanning a period of at least 50 years. Only two other Oklahomans are among the previous recipient of this honor, one of those was an ECU alum as well – the late Bill Thrash.



# ECU ALUM THIRD IN PAN AM GAMES MARATHON



ECU cross country and track and field alumnus Juan-Joel Pacheco Orozco claimed the bronze medal (third place) in the 2019 Pan American Games Marathon in late July while representing his home

country of Mexico. He finished with a time of 2:12:10, just behind his Mexican teammate Jose Luis Santana (2:10:54), who captured the silver. Earlier this year, Orozco set an Olympic A standard time in the marathon at the 2019 Chevron Houston Marathon and Aramco Houston Half Marathon. He is eligible to compete for Mexico in the 2020 Olympics in Tokyo, Japan.
