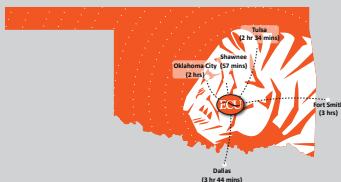

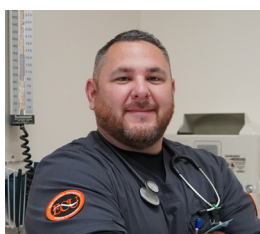
\$how Me the Money!

BS with a Major in Nursing
