We are excited to share that the following items are now available on CECPD's website, accessible to providers and anyone who is interested:

Oklahoma Quality Child Care Program Scale: Self-Assessment. A

short (approximately 15 minute) video training is now available on CECPD's website about the new self-assessment scale*. This video will help programs become familiar with how to use the scale and also assist them in understanding more about the Oklahoma Core Competencies as well as the program evaluation process required for Stars. Two Star programs (homes and centers) need to complete the self-assessment tool before November 1, 2018 prior to updating their program goals and then annually thereafter. (Please keep the completed document at your program for licensing staff to review.) Nationally accredited programs and Head Starts are not required to complete the self-assessment scale. The video training is voluntary and is located at <u>www.cecpd.org</u> in the Resources tab and under QRIS Video Training.
