**Annual Vital Statistics Report**  
**2021-2022**

The Clinical Rehabilitation and Clinical Mental Health Counseling program at East Central University is fully accredited by the Council on Rehabilitation Education (CORE) through October 31, 2023 [www.core-rehab.org](http://www.core-rehab.org) and through the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP) through October 31, 2023 [www.cacrep.org](http://www.cacrep.org). The CRCMHC program is required annually to report program information for students and prospective students.

In 2021-2022, there were 59 CRCMHC students enrolled in the fall 2021 and 61 in the spring of 2022. During this review period, 81% of students graduated from the CRCMHC program. Students in the CRCMHC program complete their Master's degree within 3 years if enrolled full time or within 6 years if enrolled part time. Of the students from the CRCMHC program, 100% were employed as rehabilitation and/or mental health counselors following graduation. CRCMHC program graduates are employed in a wide variety of settings including outpatient counseling agencies, inpatient treatment programs, private practice counseling settings, integrated healthcare settings, residential treatment settings, and in governmental settings (state, tribal, and federal).

CRCMHC students have competed the National Counselor Exam (NCE) and/or the Certified Rehabilitation Counselors Exam. The most recently available pass rate data for program students taking the NCE is 62.5%, which is comparable to the national pass rate for this exam. There is no available data on students who completed the CRC Exam during this cycle due to low participation rate. The CRCC Commission only collects data if six or more students from program complete the national examination.

The CRCMHC program student body is 82% female, 19% male, 17% First American, 7% African American, 59% are Caucasian, and 8% identified as multiracial. Multiple CRCMHC students are members of the Oklahoma Counseling Association and participated in the Oklahoma Counseling Association conference in 2022.
