

Measles Outbreak Information from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)

The CDC is asking for your help to ensure that all children and families are up to date on the measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine. When it comes to vaccination, parents trust the expertise of their doctor more than anyone else. As families work with their doctors, it's important that Head Start, Early Head Start, and child care staff help parents understand that the MMR vaccine is the best protection against measles infection.

From Jan. 1 to Feb 21, 2019, 159** people from 10 states (i.e., CA, CO, CT, GA, IL, NJ, NY, OR, TX, and WA) have been reported as having measles. Five outbreaks, defined as three or more linked cases, have been reported: Rockland County, Monroe County, and New York City, NY; Washington state; Texas; and Illinois. Of these outbreaks, two are ongoing from 2018. The CDC urges healthcare professionals to ensure that all patients are up to date on MMR vaccine, including international travel.

- + Provide MMR vaccine information to parents
- + Ensure all children in your program are up to date on MMR Vaccine:

Children need two doses of MMR: one dose at 12-15 months old and another dose at 4-6 years old.

Saving Time - Sharing Costs - Increasing Quality

On January 2, 2019, the OK Shared Services program was rolled out to give child care providers, in both centers and homes, increased access to a variety of services and opportunities while saving time and money. One free year of membership is granted to all Oklahoma providers. Membership fees for subsequent years are minimal and the savings being offered are great.

The response of the 325 who registered during the first three months of operations could not be more positive. Reports of savings in necessary materials, supplies and food costs show that centers can save hundreds each year. In addition, programs such as TeleMed, payroll, insurance and educational assistance, are offering services at great savings. One center director was quoted that the lesson plans offered were excellent and have been a great asset to her providers.

As the program has developed, the website has been modified for ease in accessing the wide variety of information provided.
