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The Oklahoma Right Start Infant Toddler Project was rolled out in the latter part of 2018. The GOAL of this program is to help improve the quality of the child care program by building a strong foundation between the families, the communities, and the child care programs. The FOCUS is to build relationships with providers and help create opportunities that support positive interactions with child and families. We want our providers to thrive and feel confident in their daily tasks in the classroom to enhance the quality of care infants and toddlers receive. We will strive to model positive behavior and support providers through resources, trainings, and technical assistance.

How will this program help your child care center? You will:

- receive free formal training.
- receive 30 hours of coaching for staff by an Infant Toddler Specialist.
- build effective learning environments.
- increase community involvement and support through resources.
- receive help with goal setting based on observations.

With the addition of this new and exciting program, the ECU South-central Child Care Resource and Referral Agency has hired an Infant Toddler Specialist to join the staff. Lindsay Christian joined the staff on November 1, 2018. She has a Bachelor of Science in Education from the University of Oklahoma and is currently working on a Master of Education degree at ECU. She was a caregiver in a preschool in Norman before teaching kindergarten for two years. Lindsay is married to husband, Preston, and they have four children, Chalin, Collin, Carinne, and Callan.

OK Shared Services

Coming January 2, 2019, OK Shared Services is a password-protected platform featuring tools that support the needs of early childhood education and care professionals. By providing quick links to state and federal regulations, samples and templates of procedures, policies, forms, toolkits, handbooks, and more, OK Shared Services helps providers manage their programs more efficiently and effectively.

Because the early childhood education and care sector is challenged with rising costs, shrinking budgets, a changing workforce, diversified needs of children and their families and the constant demand to improve quality, OK Shared Services is designed to save both time and money.

Pre-negotiated discounts are available on a variety of products and services used by early childhood education and care programs throughout the US. Types of programs include: payroll, office and classroom supplies, facilities and janitorial supplies, uniforms, website development, food, insurance, and more. Cost savings within the program range from 10% to 55%, depending on the program.

Participation is by membership. Every provider will be given a free year of membership from their first login during 2019 with unlimited users. After the first year, membership fees are as follows:

Family Child Care Homes-\$35 per year with 2 user logins.

Child Care Centers with a licensed capacity of 99 or fewer-\$110 per year with 4 user logins.

Child Care Centers with a licensed capacity of 100 or more-\$150 per year with 6 user logins.

Additional users are \$10 each.
