We all recognize that we could not make it without dedicated staff who show up every day ready to make a child's life brighter and easier. But what keeps them going? Sometimes it's the simple things. One of my favorite motto is "little things do make a big difference".

Like children, adults need some down time too. We all reach our breaking point from time to time and need to recognize the signs for when someone needs to step away. Difficulty concentrating, irritability, fatigue and sadness all could be an indication that a break is needed.

We are still at it! We have added four more <u>bulletin board kits</u> to the list and have plans to make more. However, if you would like one designed for a special occasion or have an idea for one you would like, just let us know. We will do our best to replicate it. We get lots of ideas from Pinterest and can re-create most. <u>Die cuts</u> are also popular, being used in room displays and art projects. We have over 200 shapes available, in 4 inch, 10 inch and minis. We have the letters of the alphabet in both capital and lower case, numbers and have now added a few words to the list. (see the photos below) Tell us what you need, how many and what colors and we will cut them for you. Best of all, **we will mail or deliver to you free of charge!**

As you can see below, we have a **Happy Birthday** board and a **Welcome** board. We chose a few shapes we liked for them but there are so many to choose from we had a hard time deciding. Tell us what you want and we will include them. Our **Meet the Crew** board is great for any time of the year, as is our **We Are All a Different Shade of the Same Color**. All can be customized with names so let us know how many children you have so we can send enough.

Have you thought about checking some things our of our lending library? Summer is a great time to do that, as we have lots of <u>outdoor activities</u>. Kids love to try new things and you can borrow from us to present a new topic, try out something before you buy it or just offer something new for awhile. And, yes, we deliver these also. We are updating our lists and creating some new <u>activity sets</u> where you can borrow a group of related activities. One delivered last week was for a "game day" for outside. It consisted of a parachute, yard dice, an egg and spoon game, an obstacle course, and hula hoops. We have <u>music activities</u>, consisting of such items as rhythm sticks, drums, a tambourine, and rain sticks. Need <u>STEM activities</u>? We have those too! Again, just let us know what you would like to check out and we will get it to you. We have lots of other items, including <u>books</u>, <u>CDs</u>, <u>DVDs</u>, and <u>cassettes</u> for both children and training providers, and <u>theme boxes</u>.

At last count Oklahoma had nearly 900 registrants for membership with OK Shared Services! What is Shared Services? This program provides assistance to all Oklahoma child care providers in a SHARING COSTS · INCREASING QUALITY variety of ways. Not only does it provide lesson plans and other

valuable teaching aides but your membership can benefit with cost savings, medical and insurance benefits, tele-med access, classroom assessment tools, form templates, help with job descriptions and training, communication skill development tools, employee benefits and more. (The ECU CCRR staff regularly uses OK Shared Services when ordering materials through Lakeshore and Discount School Supplies. The savings allow us to purchase even more items for our Lending Library and Resource Room.)

A monthly newsletter provides up-to-date information on a large variety of topics relevant to child care. These topics may include safety, dealing with trauma (very relevant during these times), interaction with parents, and much more.

The OK Shared Services program began in January, 2019, to give child care providers, in both centers and homes, increased access to a variety of services and opportunities while saving time and money. One free year of membership is granted to all Oklahoma providers. Membership fees for subsequent years are minimal and the service is second to none. If you as a center, or individual teacher, haven't signed up, do so now. (Directors, please share this program with all of your teachers and workers. They are all eligible for membership.)

What Is the Scholars Program?

The Scholars Program awards scholarships to eligible child care professionals to complete coursework in the area of child development or early childhood education, as well as the Child Development Associate (CDA) and Certified Childcare Professional (CCP) Credential Assessment. These scholarships enable child care providers in Oklahoma to improve their skills through education, receive an educational stipend, and continue the availability of quality child care in local communities.

Mission Statement

The Scholars for Excellence in Child Care Program ensures that eligible child care professionals in the state of Oklahoma have an opportunity to attend a technology center or community college to further their education while earning a Child Development Associate (CDA) Credential, Certificate of Mastery, Director's Certificate of Completion, and/or an associate degree in child development or early childhood education.

Stipends Available

Stipends are available through the Scholars for Excellence in Child Care Program, valued from \$800-\$122, for eligible scholars as they earn one or more credentials. Credentials can be earned toward CDA, CCP, CoM, SACoC, DCoC, DCoM, an Associate Degree or a Bachelor's Degree.

On March 11, 2020 the Novel Coronavirus Disease, COVID-19 was declared a pandemic by the World Health Organization. On March 13, 2020 a national emergency was declared in the United States concerning the COVID-19 Outbreak. OKLAHOMA REGISTRY Certificate of Achievement Stipend Program

AN UPDATE FROM THE DIRECTOR AT CEDPD:



Greetings Friends,

Beginning August 1, 2020, there will be significant changes to the Certificate of Achievement and Stipend Program. Please read the following information carefully.

- 1. Training hours will remain at 30 hours (rather than 40 hours) indefinitely.
- 2. You can now receive two (2) stipends in a one-year period (not calendar year).
- 3. Participants no longer need to have their director complete the employment verification form.
- 4. In lieu of the employment verification form, participants must send a copy of a current pay-stub.
- 5. There is no longer a child care subsidy requirement to participate in the program.
- Participants will print their own Certificates of Achievement. You will receive an email when your certificate is awarded. The email will inform you of the area of concentration that was awarded and give you instructions on how to print the certificate.

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Talk with someone as to why they became a teacher. Find out what their goals are. Reconnect to intention. Reflection helps us all find meaning in our work. Home care providers, you need this also. We need to be remember just how special we are.

Whether it be a new concept or idea, an addition of resources or change in policy, include those folks it affects in the process. Good communication is a key component to creating a positive environment. And when you and your teachers are happy, the children will follow the lead.





And speaking of resources, if possible, provide new ones occasionally. Additional learning tools in the classroom, access to training (maybe on the teachers work time) or upgrading a classroom are all well earned rewards for being a valued part of an organization.

OK, here's the biggie and this applies to directors and home care providers as well as teachers. TAKE TIME FOR YOURSELF!!! Create a daily self-care routine, such as a daily walk, healthy eating or personal care. Take time out to find a quiet corner. Engage socially with colleagues and friends. Participate in hobbies such as reading, sewing, or cooking. These

are not luxuries; they are essential components to reward a job well done. And you ALL do a great job and are appreciated more than you will ever know.
